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Organization Description: Fairhaven High School is a grade 9-12 facility located in the suburban community of Fairhaven, Massachusetts. The high school facility known as the "Castle on the Hill" for its historic connections to Henry Huttleston Rogers serves approximately 670 students from the Towns of Fairhaven and Acushnet. Fairhaven High School is fully accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. As a Renaissance school, Fairhaven High School's academic and athletic programs stress respect, responsibility and rigor in all aspects of teaching and student learning. At Fairhaven High School excellence is the cultural norm.

This report card contains information required by the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) for our school and district including: student enrollment and teacher qualifications, student achievement, accountability, and the progress our school is making toward narrowing proficiency gaps for different groups of students.

If the actual 2017 participation rate was lower than 95 percent (high schools) or 90 percent (schools and districts administering Next-Generation MCAS test in grades 3-8) for any group in any subject, that rate was compared to the average of the most recent two years of assessment participation data for that group and subject. The higher of the two resulting rates was factored into the assignment of the school or district's 2017 accountability and assistance level.
